### From the Pastor's Desk

<sup>16</sup> For though I am free with respect to all, I have made myself a slave to all, so that I might win more of them. <sup>20</sup> To the Jews I became as a Jew, in order to win Jews. To those under the law I became as one under the law (though I myself am not under the law) so that I might win those under the law. <sup>21</sup> To those outside the law I became as one outside the law (though I am not free from God's law but am under Christ's law) so that I might win those outside the law. <sup>22</sup> To the weak I became weak, so that I might win the weak. I have become all things to all people, that I might by all means save some. <sup>23</sup> I do it all for the sake of the gospel, so that I may share in its blessings.

- 1 Corinthians 9:19-23

We are called to proclaim the Gospel - the Good News - of Jesus Christ. We hear this each week, yet, there are times in which we find ourselves doubting our ability to do that. We think that we are not skilled enough, didn't have the right schooling, don't have the right words, or aren't a good enough Christian. And sometimes we worry a lot about the recipient; we are unsure how they might handle hearing that Jesus Christ died for them, and in the name of God, they are forgiven and made new.

We get trapped in the Law instead of understanding that no law can bind the Word and Promise of Christ. As Paul writes in his first letter to the Corinthians, he became like those that he was proclaiming to in order to more effectively deliver the Gospel to them.

Now, I am not saying that you must go and change your beliefs socially, politically, and certainly not religiously. However, we must be empathetic to a point. Recognizing what someone might be going through (even if we disagree with them), and still deliver the Gospel to them. Instead of Paul telling the

people that they must change before the Word was delivered to them, he proclaimed the Word and let God do the work. This is what we are called to do.

We are not called to change people. If we alone were supposed to be changing people, we would be failing at our jobs. Rather, we are called to proclaim the Word of God and that Word is what does the changing! It is the Promise of Christ that changes all of us. It's the promise that we have been given and now have the authority and power to place in other peoples' ears.

Can we control how the Word is received or if any immediate change is made? No. But we can put God's Word out there and let the Holy Spirit do its work and open up the hearts and minds of those who hear it.

This is most certainly true.
